
### Councillor R. Saralis Chairman, Leisure Services Committee

I am sure you will be delighted not only with this production but also with the knowledge



FOREWORD BY

Professor Gwyn A. Williams

One hundred and fifty years ago this November, in the greatest mobilisation of working people south Wales had seen, 20,000 men of the Valleys of Gwent set out on a long march. Their banners proclaimed their cause — *Cyfiawnder*, Justice. They were fighting for the People's Charter and full political democracy.

God had clearly never intended human beings to live up at those Valley Heads. The ironmasters corrected Him on the point. Two generations of frenetic industrialisation brought to birth a new, tough, humane, raucous and cultivated working-class society which embraced 200,000 people

They had known two generations of struggle for rights and dignity — in the Jacobin movements of the 1790s, the trade unions led by Robert Owen, the Merthyr Rising of 1831, the guerilla war of the Scotch Cattle, that highly effective resistance movement whose Welsh language shielded them from authority and whose base was Blackwood.

It was People's Charter of 1838 which set their minds on fire. Chartism, the first nation-wide workers' political movement in the western world, called for the overthrow of a narrow, oligarchical and corrupt parliament and the creation of full political democracy.

It swept up the Valleys like a crusade preached by missionaries — Henry Vincent an orator from Bristol, William Jones, actor, preacher and watchmaker from Pontypool, Zephaniah Williams, mineral agent, innkeeper and freethinker of Blaina, Dr. William Price, surgeon and Druid of Pontypridd, Morgan Williams, pioneer of a people's press from Merthyr. All sorts of local leaders sprang to life, like Jack the Fifer, John Rees, mason of Tredegar who'd fought with the army of Texas as San Anton.

It was a movement drenched in colour and ritual — young girls in white dresses carrying forests of green flags, songs, marches, dances, penillion singing. They had their own Tricolour devised by Hugh Williams of Carmarthen (the grey eminence of Rebecca and Her Daughters in the west). On that tricolour, they swore an oath to live or die by the People's Charter. When Parliament rejected the Charter, south Wales was ready to rise at once.

John Frost, draper and former Mayor of Newport, their delegate to the Chartist Convention,

John Frost, draper and former Mayor of Newport, their delegate to the Chartist Convention, persuaded them to wait until he'd rallied support in England. They planned a five-pronged assault throughout south Wales. They were to take over south Wales and ignite rebellion throughout Britain, to be what Che Guevara once called the little motor which starts the big one going.

No support came. They lost patience and went ahead on their own. There was a last-minute change of plan. D-Day had been fixed for Guy Fawkes' Day! Now the Gwent people were told to concentrate on Newport and move a day early. This was a fatal mistake, compounded by the foul weather. The rebellion was a disaster and its leaders became martyrs.

But that was not the end of Chartism. it was more like a beginning. Within weeks of Newport, Morgan Williams brought out *Udgorn Cymru* the Trumpet of Wales, one of our greatest popular newspapers. Chartism surged again, in 1840, 1842, 1848, the 1860s. And within a hundred years, the People's Charter had become the British Way of Life.

Then, of course, the People needed a new Charter. The People will always need a Charter. That is why it is necessary to remember and salute those brave and generous men and women of 150 years ago. We need their memory. For we are still trudging on that long march to justice.





#### Tony Biggin:— Composer

Tony Biggin, composer, teacher, pianist and musical director of the Leaveners since their inception in 1978, was born in 1952. He was educated at Ackworth School, Yorkshire, and at the University of Wales in University College, Bangor, where he studied music with William Mathias and Sebastian Forbes. During his first teaching appointment with the Inner London Education Authority at Clissold Park School he discovered an ability that was later to flower into a passion for writing large-cast school musicals with immediately catchy melodies.

So it was no surprise, when he was appointed head of music at Jordanthorpe School, Sheffield, that he wrote both words and music to a first-ever 'skatboard rock opera' (King Wozzy) and a Christmas cantata (Begin Again at Bethlehem), the latter of which is now widely performed in primary and secondary schools. Both enthusiastically involved half the school in their presentation. Subsequently, as head of music in Ysgol Aberconwy, North Wales, he wrote, to the librettos of Ron Grindley, full length scores for two musical plays, 'Rats', and the 'Circle of Gilt', the latter since released as an LP by Tryfan, Sain Recordings.

Over seven years Tony Biggin has collaborated with librettist Alec Davison to write more than 150 songs for the Leaveners (a Youth Theatre drawing young people from all over Britain) in four heroic-mythic music-dramas, 'Quest of the Golden Eye' (1979), 'Bull of Minos' (1980), 'Fires of Levana' (1981) and 'Ring of Darkness' (1982) as well as a musical biography of the young George Fox, the 'Fire and the Hammer', a new musical comedy, 'Pigs among the Roses', still being worked on, and also in four full length revues (1981-1984). In May 1983 Plant Life Records released 'Bird of Freedom', an LP of songs from some of these shows and while producing the record Tony learned that Stainer and Bell were to publish eight of the songs in the 'Songs of Tony Biggin and Alec Davison'. In March 1985, Blow-up Tapes produced a cassette of twelve of their songs, 'Finger on the Button'. As well as acting as musical director to each of these productions, he also directs a small travelling singing group, 'Q for a Song', which performs nationally.

#### Alison Hughes (Designer)

Studied sculpture at Sheffield Polytechnic and in California. Worked in artists studios in Leicester and Cardiff (AADW) and began work as a theatre designer at the Sherman Theatre in Cardiff with set, costume, poster and lighting designs for student and local companies. Productions included Chilighting designs for student and local companies. Productions included Clicago, The Hard Man, The Hostage, The Mikado, Cloud Nine and The Fool. Then moved to London to study Theatre Design Diploma with Margaret Harris at Riverside Studios. Design work since then includes National Opera Studio at the Bloomsbury Theatre, Fringe productions at The Old Red Lion, Offstage Downstairs and The Rose Tavern, 'Pax' by Deborah Levy at Chapter Arts Centre in Cardiff. Also worked as assistant designer for the New Sculpture Gallery at the Walker in Liverpool, designer Charles Ryder, and assisted Brien Vahey at Leicester Haymarket Theatre. Now a freelance designer and modelmaker, most recent production - set and costume designs for 'Peter Grimes' by Benjamin Britten for Opera Milton Keynes in April 1989.



#### **Blackwood Amateur Operatic Society**

Blackwood Miners Welfare Operatic Society was formed before the Second World War, but during the war time of course it was disbanded.

The group meets at Oxford House, Risca every Tuesday at 7pm. New members are always welcome.

The Band was formed in 1928 and was known as the Markham British Legion Band. In 1930 it became the Markham & District Colliery Silver Prize Band. Post war the Band began the long ascent to Championship Standard eventually achieved in 1958.

1968 it became Champion Band of Wales and between 1969-1976 the band was chosen to form the National Brass Band of Wales performing at the National Eisteddfod and the Royal Albert Hall.



## Newbridge & District Ladies' Choir

Musical Director: Mr W. E. Dyte. Accompanist: John Emery. Was formed in 1962 by Mrs Dorothy Davies Jones of Newbridge, have a membership of 38 and give many concerts for charities, senior citizens and hospitals.

### Oakdale Youth Choir

Oakdale Youth Choir was formed in September 1985, most members being past or present pupils of Oakdale Comprehensive School. Rehearsals take place weekly, on a Tuesday evening, at Oakdale Youth Centre.

Throughout their school careers (from 11 to 16 years) they had been members of the school choir. Their musical activities, in school, culminated in a highly acclaimed theatrical performance of "Jesus Christ Superstar".

Many were due to leave school that summer. So, it was decided that a youth choir should be formed in order to keep the group together. Since then the Oakdale Youth choir has gone from strength to strength.

They regularly give concerts in South Wales and are undefeated at eisteddfodau and competitive festivals throughout Wales. In the Autumn of 1986 they reached the semi-final of the Sainsbury's "Choir of the Year" Competition representing Wales and the West of England. The choir made three network appearances on BBC TV.

Also, the choir has performed with the BBC Concert Orchestra as part of the Welsh Counties Youth Choir in a Royal Gala Performance which was broadcast on BBC Radio.

A number of the choir are still in school and are also members of the Oakdale Comprehensive School Choir. In 1988 the school choir, under the same conductor, won second prize in the "BBC Wales School Choir of the Year" Competition. The final was broadcast

These successes establish the name of Oakdale among the top ranks of youth choral music in the UK.

Many of the choristers sing with the Gwent Youth choir and two of the choir have gained entry into the prestigious National Youth Choir of Wales.

The choir's steadily increasing repertoire covers almost 400 years of choral music, ranging from English Madrigals and Welsh Folk Songs to Twentieth Century works, taking in larger works such as Vivaldi's "Gloria" and Faure's "Requiem" on the way. Lighter works also feature in the choir's repertoire, the aim being to give a balanced programme of music.

Oakdale Youth Choir is a mixed choir of almost 40 voices. In July 1987 they visited Austria and, in March 1989, they visited Washington DC, Virginia, Pennsylvania and Maryland, USA.

In July 1989 they sang at the Queen Elizabeth Hall, South Bank, London in the National Festival of Music for Youth.

Plans for 1990 include a visit from an American High School choir and competing at the Llangollen International Musical Eisteddfod. Conductor Nigel Jones trained at the Welsh College of Music and Drama where he won academic, composition and woodwind prizes. He has been head of Music at Oakdale Comprehensive School since 1979.

Accompanist David Blackwell graduated from University College, Cardiff with an honours B.Mus. and later studied at the University of London. He was a tutor at the Welsh College of Music and Drama from 1974 to 1985 and presently teaches at the Tertiary College, Cross Keys, Gwent. As an accompanist he has worked throughout Wales and also in London and Vienna.

# Mynyddislwyn Male Voice Choir

The Mynyddislwyn Male Voice Choir was formed in 1969 and during these past twenty years has grown from twelve members to well over one hundred. The choir is based in Blackwood, with the membership coming from around the vicinity.

The choir acclaims itself principally on helping charitable organisations and receives many requests throughout the year for concerts. The choir has travelled to various towns and cities in England and Wales to assist in charitable fund raising events. This is largely due to the success of the choir and its increasing reputation as one of Wales' leading choirs.

Indeed their choir has achieved many successes at Eisteddfod competitions but regard the concert platform as its forte.

The choir has given concerts in such distinguished venues as Colston Hall, Bristol, and St David's Hall, Cardiff. Last year the choir gave a prestigious concert at the Grand Hall, Eton College. The previous year the choir sang at the Royal Albert Hall, London, as guests of the Church of England Children's Society.

The Mynyddislwyn choir is "twinned" with the Hanover Sing-Kreis "Aloe" choir in Germany. Regular exchange visits take place between the choirs. Last April the Mynyddislwyn Choir travelled to Hanover and performed in concert with their fellow German singers. In 1990 our German friends will visit Wales.

The Spring of 1987 saw the release of the choir's first record "Islwyn in Harmony". This recording proved a great success, its popularity influencing the choir to make another recording. At the end of last year, for Christmas, "Islwyn in Harmony" Vol II, was released. Both records and cassettes are still available.

The Band was founded some 40 years ago — based in Newbridge 75% of band members, are youth players of the County — many of whom are members of the Gwent County Youth Brass Band & the National Youth Brass Band of Wales —

Christmastide, the Band are carolling from the beginning of December up until Christmas Eve.

Last year the Band gained promotion from the 3rd Section to the 2nd Section within the Welsh grading system. They represented Wales at the National Championships in London.

Spring Bank holiday 1988 saw the band sail across the sea to the Isle of Man Music festival.

The Band is led by principal cornet player Adrian Harris & directed by Mr Neil Watson.
